**AMENDMENT TO THE AMENDMENT IN THE
NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE TO H.R. 2868
OFFERED BY MR. SHRADER OF OREGON AND
MR. KISELL OF NORTH CAROLINA**

Page 54, line 24, strike "SECTORAL IMPACTS" and insert "AGRICULTURAL SECTOR".

Page 55, beginning on line 12, strike "IMPACTS OF COMPLIANCE" and insert "AGRICULTURAL IMPACTS".

Page 55, beginning on line 19, strike "by manufacturers, retailers, aerial commercial applicators, and distributors of pesticide and fertilizer" and insert "on the agricultural sector".

Page 55, line 23, insert a comma after "Representatives".

Page 55, line 24, strike "and" before "the Committee".

Page 55 line 25, insert ", the Committee on Agriculture of the House of Representatives, and the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition and Forestry of the Senate" after "Senate".

Page 56, line 4, insert “agricultural” after “scope of”.

Page 57, beginning on line 15, strike “other sectors engaged in commerce” and insert “agricultural end-users”.

Strike line 20 on page 57 and all that follows through page 58, line 2, and insert the following:

1 “(3) DEFINITIONS.—In this subsection:

2 “(A) FARM SUPPLIES MERCHANT WHOLE-
3 SALER.—The term ‘farm supplies merchant
4 wholesaler’ means a covered chemical facility
5 that is primarily engaged in the merchant
6 wholesale distribution of farm supplies, such as
7 animal feeds, fertilizers, agricultural chemicals,
8 pesticides, plant seeds, and plant bulbs.

9 “(B) AGRICULTURAL END-USERS.—The
10 term ‘agricultural end-users’ means facilities
11 such as—

12 “(i) farms, including crop, fruit, nut,
13 and vegetable farms;

14 “(ii) ranches and rangeland;

15 “(iii) poultry, dairy, and equine facili-
16 ties;

17 “(iv) turfgrass growers;

- 1 “(v) golf courses;
- 2 “(vi) nurseries;
- 3 “(vii) floricultural operations; and
- 4 “(viii) public and private parks.
