REICHERT OF WASHINGTON, OR HIS DESIGNEE,  
DEBATABLE FOR 10 MINUTES:

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 1815, AS REPORTED  
OFFERED BY MR. REICHERT OF WASHINGTON**

At the end of title V (page 194, after line 11), insert the following new section:

1 **SEC. 575. REPORT ON EMPLOYMENT MATTERS FOR MEM-**  
2 **BERS OF THE NATIONAL GUARD AND RE-**  
3 **SERVE.**

4 (a) **REQUIREMENT FOR REPORT.**—Not later than  
5 270 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the  
6 Comptroller General of the United States shall submit to  
7 Congress a report on difficulties faced by members of the  
8 National Guard and Reserve with respect to employment  
9 as a result of being ordered to perform full time National  
10 Guard duty or being ordered to active duty service, respec-  
11 tively.

12 (b) **SPECIFIC MATTERS.**—In preparing the report re-  
13 quired under subsection (a), the Comptroller General shall  
14 include information on the following matters

15 (1) **TYPE OF EMPLOYERS.**—An estimate of the  
16 number of employers of members of the National  
17 Guard and Reserve who are private sector employers  
18 and those who are public sector employers.

1           (2) SIZE OF EMPLOYERS.—An estimate of the  
2           number of employers of members of the National  
3           Guard and Reserve who employ fewer than 50 full-  
4           time employees.

5           (3) SELF-EMPLOYED.—An estimate of the num-  
6           ber of members of the National Guard and Reserve  
7           who are self-employed.

8           (4) NATURE OF BUSINESS.—A description of  
9           the nature of the business of employers of members  
10          of the National Guard and Reserve.

11          (5) REEMPLOYMENT DIFFICULTIES.—A de-  
12          scription of difficulties faced by members of the Na-  
13          tional Guard and Reserve in gaining reemployment  
14          after having performed full time National Guard  
15          duty or active duty service, including difficulties  
16          faced by members who are disabled and who are  
17          Veterans of the Vietnam Era.
