**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 3, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MR. KUHLMAN OF NEW YORK**

At the end of title I of the bill, insert the following
(and conform the table of contents of the bill accordingly):

1 **SEC. 1838. AMO HOUGHTON BYPASS.**

2 (a) **FINDINGS.**—Congress finds the following:

3 (1) Amo Houghton first served his country
4 when he volunteered for military service during
5 World War II and served as a Private First Class
6 in the United States Marine Corps;

7 (2) Amo Houghton earned a bachelor's degree
8 from Harvard University and a master's degree
9 from the Harvard School of Business;

10 (3) Amo Houghton was Chief Executive Officer
11 of Corning, Incorporated, before running for Con-
12 gress and is remembered fondly for his tremendous
13 efforts to rebuild the city of Corning, New York, and
14 the Chemung Valley in the aftermath of Hurricane
15 Agnes and the devastating flood of 1972;

16 (4) Amo Houghton spent his energy and time
17 at Corning, Incorporated, Congress, and even after
18 Congress working to build up the economy of the



1 Southern Tier, Finger Lakes, and Rochester region
2 of New York;

3 (5) Amo Houghton worked tirelessly with oth-
4 ers to fund the building projects that brought New
5 York State Route 17 to the necessary standards to
6 be designated as Interstate Route 86;

7 (6) one of the major projects required to up-
8 grade New York State Route 17 to Interstate stand-
9 ards and at the same time eliminate a glaring prob-
10 lem and safety hazard was the construction of the
11 bypass route around the city of Corning, New York;

12 (7) Amo Houghton was a champion of many
13 economic, trade, and health issues during his service
14 on the Ways and Means Committee of the House of
15 Representatives, including numerous tax simplifica-
16 tion measures and successful House and Senate pas-
17 sage of the Clean Diamond Trade Act (Public Law
18 108-19) which was signed into law by President
19 George W. Bush;

20 (8) Amo Houghton was an active player on the
21 world stage as a member of the International Rela-
22 tions Committee of the House of Representatives
23 through his Chairmanships of the Canada-United
24 States Interparliamentary Group, the Asia-Pacific
25 Parliamentary Forum, the Oxford Forum, and the



1 United States-Japan Economic Agenda Forum and
2 Vice Chairmanship of the Africa Subcommittee of
3 the International Relations Committee;

4 (9) Amo Houghton served in many other capac-
5 ities for the good of Congress, including his work as
6 a founding member of the Bipartisan Retreat Com-
7 mittee of the House of Representatives, the Mem-
8 bers and Family Room Committee of the House of
9 Representatives, and as Co-Chairman of the Faith
10 and Politics Institute; and

11 (10) among his colleagues in Congress, Amo
12 Houghton will always be remembered as a man of
13 principle, statesmanship, moderation, bipartisanship,
14 and civility.

15 (b) DESIGNATION.—The Secretary of Transportation
16 shall work with the State of New York to ensure that the
17 segment of Interstate Route 86 between its interchange
18 with New York State Route 15 in the vicinity of Painted
19 Post, New York, and its interchange with New York State
20 Route 352 in the vicinity of Corning, New York, is known
21 and designated as the “Amo Houghton Bypass”.
