

11. AN AMENDMENT TO BE OFFERED BY REPRESENTATIVE  
Kucinich OF Ohio, OR HIS  
DESIGNEE, DEBATABLE FOR 10 MINUTES:

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 1684, AS REPORTED  
OFFERED BY MR. KUCINICH OF OHIO**

At the end of title XI of the bill, add the following  
(and conform the table of contents accordingly):

**1 SEC. 1122. WEATHER-RELATED DISASTERS.**

2 (a) STUDY.—Of the amount authorized to be appro-  
3 priated under section 101, the Administrator of the Fed-  
4 eral Emergency Management Agency shall use such sums  
5 as may be necessary to conduct a comprehensive study of  
6 the increase in demand for the Agency's emergency re-  
7 sponse and disaster relief services that may be reasonably  
8 anticipated as a result of weather-related disasters associ-  
9 ated with global warming during the next 5, 10, and 20  
10 years, including tornadoes, hurricanes, severe storms, and  
11 associated flooding.

12 (b) ANALYSIS OF IMPLICATIONS OF INCREASED DE-  
13 MAND FOR FEMA SERVICES.—The study shall include an  
14 analysis of the budgetary, material, and manpower impli-  
15 cations of meeting such increased demand for the Agen-  
16 cy's services.

17 (c) CONSIDERATION OF SCIENTIFIC DATA.—In con-  
18 ducting the study, the Administrator shall consider the  
19 latest scientific data on global warming, including the

1 fourth assessment report of the Intergovernmental Panel  
2 on Climate Change.

3 (d) ADVISORY COMMITTEE.—The study shall be con-  
4 ducted by the Administrator with the advice of an advisory  
5 committee consisting of Federal, regional, State, and local  
6 policy makers, industry, non-governmental organizations,  
7 and academics, to be convened by the Administrator in  
8 compliance with the Federal Advisory Committee Act (5  
9 U.S.C. App.).

10 (e) REPORT.—Not later than 12 months after the  
11 date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator shall  
12 transmit to Congress a report containing the results of  
13 the study.
