

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 2200, AS REPORTED  
OFFERED BY MR. OBERSTAR OF MINNESOTA**

Strike section 212 of the bill and insert the following:

1 **SEC. 212. SECURITY SCREENING OF INDIVIDUALS WITH**  
2 **METAL IMPLANTS TRAVELING IN AIR TRANS-**  
3 **PORTATION.**

4 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Section 44903 of title 49, United  
5 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-  
6 lowing:

7 “(m) **SECURITY SCREENING OF INDIVIDUALS WITH**  
8 **METAL IMPLANTS.**—

9 “(1) **IN GENERAL.**—The Assistant Secretary  
10 shall carry out a program to ensure fair treatment  
11 in the security screening of individuals with metal  
12 implants traveling in air transportation.

13 “(2) **PROGRAM.**—The program shall—

14 “(A) improve security screening procedures  
15 for individuals with metal implants to limit dis-  
16 ruptions in the screening process while main-  
17 taining security; and

18 “(B) include a credential or system that  
19 incorporates biometric technology or other ap-

1           plicable technologies to verify the identity of an  
2           individual who has a metal implant.

3           “(3) METAL IMPLANT DEFINED.—In this sub-  
4           section, the term ‘metal implant’ means a metal de-  
5           vice or object that has been surgically implanted or  
6           otherwise placed in the body of an individual, includ-  
7           ing a metal device used in a hip or knee replace-  
8           ment, a metal plate, a metal screw, a metal rod in-  
9           side a bone, and any other metal orthopedic im-  
10          plant.”.

11          (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—Not later than 18 months  
12 after the date of enactment of this Act, the Assistant Sec-  
13 retary shall establish the program required by the amend-  
14 ment made by subsection (a).
