1       **TITLE I—AUTHORIZATION OF**  
2                                   **APPROPRIATIONS**

3       **SEC. 101. ADMINISTRATION OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS.**

4       The following amounts are authorized to be appro-  
5       priated for the Department of State under “Administra-  
6       tion of Foreign Affairs” to carry out the authorities, func-  
7       tions, duties, and responsibilities in the conduct of foreign  
8       affairs of the United States, and for other purposes au-  
9       thorized by law:

10               (1) DIPLOMATIC AND CONSULAR PROGRAMS.—

11                       (A) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIA-  
12                       TIONS.—For “Diplomatic and Consular Pro-  
13                       grams” \$5,543,957,600 for fiscal year 2010,  
14                       and such sums as may be necessary for fiscal  
15                       year 2011.

16                       (B) WORLDWIDE SECURITY PROTEC-  
17                       TION.—In addition to the amounts authorized  
18                       to be appropriated by subparagraph (A),  
19                       \$1,361,978,171 for fiscal year 2010, and such  
20                       sums as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011

1 are authorized to be appropriated for worldwide  
2 security protection.

3 (C) PUBLIC DIPLOMACY.—Of the amounts  
4 authorized to be appropriated under subpara-  
5 graph (A), such sums as may be necessary for  
6 each of fiscal years 2010 and 2011 are author-  
7 ized to be appropriated for public diplomacy.

8 (D) BUREAU OF DEMOCRACY, HUMAN  
9 RIGHTS, AND LABOR.—Of the amounts author-  
10 ized to be appropriated under subparagraph  
11 (A), \$20,659,000 for fiscal year 2010, and such  
12 sums as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011  
13 are authorized to be appropriated for the Bu-  
14 reau of Democracy, Human Rights, and Labor.

15 (2) CAPITAL INVESTMENT FUND.—For “Cap-  
16 ital Investment Fund”, \$73,627,000 for fiscal year  
17 2010, and such sums as may be necessary for fiscal  
18 year 2011.

19 (3) EMBASSY SECURITY, CONSTRUCTION AND  
20 MAINTENANCE.—For “Embassy Security, Construc-  
21 tion and Maintenance”, \$1,815,050,000 for fiscal  
22 year 2010, and such sums as may be necessary for  
23 fiscal year 2011.

24 (4) EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL EXCHANGE  
25 PROGRAMS.—

1 (A) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIA-  
2 TIONS.—For “Educational and Cultural Ex-  
3 change Programs”, \$557,906,000 for fiscal  
4 year 2010, and such sums as may be necessary  
5 for fiscal year 2011.

6 (B) TIBETAN SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM.—  
7 Of the amounts authorized to be appropriated  
8 under subsection (a), such sums as may be nec-  
9 essary for each of fiscal years 2010 and 2011  
10 are authorized to be appropriated to carry out  
11 the Tibetan scholarship program established  
12 under section 103(b)(1) of the Human Rights,  
13 Refugee, and Other Foreign Relations Provi-  
14 sions Act of 1996 (Public Law 104–319; 22  
15 U.S.C. 2151 note).

16 (C) NGAWANG CHOEPHEL EXCHANGE PRO-  
17 GRAMS.—Of the amounts authorized to be ap-  
18 propriated under subsection (a), such sums as  
19 may be necessary for each of fiscal years 2010  
20 and 2011 are authorized to be appropriated for  
21 the “Ngawang Choepel Exchange Programs”  
22 (formerly known as “programs of educational  
23 and cultural exchange between the United  
24 States and the people of Tibet”) under section  
25 103(a) of the Human Rights, Refugee, and

1 Other Foreign Relations Provisions Act of 1996  
2 (Public Law 104-319; 22 U.S.C. 2151 note).

3 (5) CIVILIAN STABILIZATION INITIATIVE.—For  
4 “Civilian Stabilization Initiative”, \$46,665,000 for  
5 fiscal year 2010, and such sums as may be nec-  
6 essary for fiscal year 2011.

7 (6) REPRESENTATION ALLOWANCES.—For  
8 “Representation Allowances”, \$8,175,000 for fiscal  
9 year 2010, and such sums as may be necessary for  
10 fiscal year 2011.

11 (7) PROTECTION OF FOREIGN MISSIONS AND  
12 OFFICIALS.—

13 (A) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIA-  
14 TIONS.—For Protection of Foreign Missions  
15 and Officials, \$23,658,118 for fiscal year 2010,  
16 and such sums as may be necessary for fiscal  
17 year 2011.

18 (B) REIMBURSEMENT FOR PAST EX-  
19 PENSES OWED BY THE UNITED STATES.—In  
20 addition to the amounts authorized to be appro-  
21 priated under subparagraph (A), there are au-  
22 thorized to be appropriated such sums as may  
23 be necessary for each of fiscal years 2010 and  
24 2011 for “Protection of Foreign Missions and  
25 Officials” to be used to reimburse State and

1 local governments for necessary expenses in-  
2 curred since 1998 for the protection of foreign  
3 missions and officials and recognized by the  
4 United States.

5 (8) EMERGENCIES IN THE DIPLOMATIC AND  
6 CONSULAR SERVICE.—For “Emergencies in the Dip-  
7 lomatic and Consular Service”, \$9,333,000 for fiscal  
8 year 2010, and such sums as may be necessary for  
9 fiscal year 2011.

10 (9) REPATRIATION LOANS.—For “Repatriation  
11 Loans”, \$1,403,061 for fiscal year 2010, and such  
12 sums as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011.

13 (10) PAYMENT TO THE AMERICAN INSTITUTE  
14 IN TAIWAN.—For “Payment to the American Insti-  
15 tute in Taiwan”, \$17,463,080 for fiscal year 2010,  
16 and such sums as may be necessary for fiscal year  
17 2011.

18 (11) OFFICE OF THE INSPECTOR GENERAL.—

19 (A) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIA-  
20 TIONS.—For “Office of the Inspector General”,  
21 \$101,201,000 for fiscal year 2010, and such  
22 sums as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011.

23 (B) SPECIAL INSPECTOR GENERAL FOR  
24 IRAQ RECONSTRUCTION.—Of the amounts au-  
25 thorized to be appropriated under subparagraph

1 (A), such sums as may be necessary authorized  
2 to be for the Special Inspector General for Iraq  
3 Reconstruction.

4 (C) SPECIAL INSPECTOR GENERAL FOR  
5 AFGHANISTAN RECONSTRUCTION.—Of the  
6 amounts authorized to be appropriated under  
7 subparagraph (A), such sums as may be nec-  
8 essary authorized to be for the Special Inspec-  
9 tor General for Afghanistan Reconstruction.

10 **SEC. 102. INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS.**

11 (a) ASSESSED CONTRIBUTIONS TO INTERNATIONAL  
12 ORGANIZATIONS.—There are authorized to be appro-  
13 priated for “Contributions to International Organiza-  
14 tions”, \$1,604,400,000 for fiscal year 2010, and such  
15 sums as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011, for the  
16 Department of State to carry out the authorities, func-  
17 tions, duties, and responsibilities in the conduct of the for-  
18 eign affairs of the United States with respect to inter-  
19 national organizations and to carry out other authorities  
20 in law consistent with such purposes.

21 (b) CONTRIBUTIONS FOR INTERNATIONAL PEACE-  
22 KEEPING ACTIVITIES.—There are authorized to be appro-  
23 priated for “Contributions for International Peacekeeping  
24 Activities”, \$2,260,000,000 for fiscal year 2010, and such  
25 sums as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011, for the

1 Department of State to carry out the authorities, func-  
2 tions, duties, and responsibilities of the United States with  
3 respect to international peacekeeping activities and to  
4 carry out other authorities in law consistent with such  
5 purposes.

6 (e) FOREIGN CURRENCY EXCHANGE RATES.—In ad-  
7 dition to amounts authorized to be appropriated by sub-  
8 section (a), there are authorized to be appropriated such  
9 sums as may be necessary for each of fiscal years 2010  
10 and 2011 to offset adverse fluctuations in foreign currency  
11 exchange rates. Amounts appropriated under this sub-  
12 section shall be available for obligation and expenditure  
13 only to the extent that the Director of the Office of Man-  
14 agement and Budget determines and certifies to Congress  
15 that such amounts are necessary due to such fluctuations.

16 **SEC. 103. INTERNATIONAL COMMISSIONS.**

17 The following amounts are authorized to be appro-  
18 priated under “International Commissions” for the De-  
19 partment of State to carry out the authorities, functions,  
20 duties, and responsibilities in the conduct of the foreign  
21 affairs of the United States and for other purposes author-  
22 ized by law:

23 (1) INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY AND WATER  
24 COMMISSION, UNITED STATES AND MEXICO.—For

1 “International Boundary and Water Commission,  
2 United States and Mexico”—

3 (A) for “Salaries and Expenses”,  
4 \$32,256,000 for fiscal year 2010, and such  
5 sums as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011;  
6 and

7 (B) for “Construction”, \$43,250,000 for  
8 fiscal year 2010, and such sums as may be nec-  
9 essary for fiscal year 2011.

10 (2) INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY COMMISSION,  
11 UNITED STATES AND CANADA.—For “International  
12 Boundary Commission, United States and Canada”,  
13 \$1,970,000 for fiscal year 2010, and such sums as  
14 may be necessary for fiscal year 2011.

15 (3) INTERNATIONAL JOINT COMMISSION.—For  
16 “International Joint Commission”, \$7,559,000 for  
17 fiscal year 2010, and such sums as may be nec-  
18 essary for fiscal year 2011.

19 (4) INTERNATIONAL FISHERIES COMMISS-  
20 SIONS.—For “International Fisheries Commissions”,  
21 \$29,925,000 for fiscal year 2010, and such sums as  
22 may be necessary for fiscal year 2011.

23 **SEC. 104. MIGRATION AND REFUGEE ASSISTANCE.**

24 (a) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.— There  
25 are authorized to be appropriated for “Migration and Ref-

1 ugee Assistance” for authorized activities \$1,577,500,000  
2 for fiscal year 2010, and such sums as may be necessary  
3 for fiscal year 2011.

4 (b) REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT IN ISRAEL.—Of the  
5 amounts authorized to be appropriated by subsection (a),  
6 there are authorized to be appropriated \$25,000,000 for  
7 fiscal years 2010 and such sums as may be necessary for  
8 fiscal year 2011 for resettlement of refugees in Israel.

9 **SEC. 105. CENTERS AND FOUNDATIONS.**

10 (a) ASIA FOUNDATION.—There are authorized to be  
11 appropriated for “The Asia Foundation” for authorized  
12 activities, \$16,592,000 for fiscal year 2010, and such  
13 sums as may be necessary for fiscal year 2011.

14 (b) NATIONAL ENDOWMENT FOR DEMOCRACY.—  
15 There are authorized to be appropriated for the “National  
16 Endowment for Democracy” for authorized activities,  
17 \$115,000,000 for fiscal year 2010, and such sums as may  
18 be necessary for fiscal year 2011.

19 (c) CENTER FOR CULTURAL AND TECHNICAL INTER-  
20 CHANGE BETWEEN EAST AND WEST.—There are author-  
21 ized to be appropriated for the “Center for Cultural and  
22 Technical Interchange Between East and West” for au-  
23 thorized activities, such sums as may be necessary for each  
24 of fiscal years 2010 and 2011.

In section 501(1), strike “\$732,187,000” and insert “\$730, 241, 919”.

In section 501(2), strike “\$13,263,000” and insert “\$11,713,952”.

In section 3(b)(1) of the Peace Corps Act, as proposed to be amended by section 602(d) of the bill, strike “\$450,000,000” and insert “\$352,580,000”.
