**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 2701, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MR. WALZ OF MINNESOTA**

Page 85, after line 20 insert the following:

1 (d) EDUCATION ON COMBAT-RELATED INJURIES.—

2 Section 3001 of the Intelligence Reform and Terrorism

3 Prevention Act of 2004 (50 U.S.C. 435b) is amended—

4 (1) by redesignating subsection (i) as subsection

5 (j); and

6 (2) by inserting after subsection (h) the fol-

7 lowing new subsection:

8 “(i) EDUCATION ON COMBAT-RELATED INJURIES.—

9 “(1) IN GENERAL.—The head of the entity se-

10 lected pursuant to subsection (b) shall take such ac-

11 tions as such head considers necessary to educate

12 each authorized adjudicative agency that is an ele-

13 ment of the intelligence community on the nature of

14 combat-related injuries as they relate to determina-

15 tions of eligibility for access to classified information

16 for veterans who were deployed in support of a con-

17 tingency operation.

18 “(2) DEFINITIONS.—In this subsection:

19 “(A) CONTINGENCY OPERATION.—The

20 term ‘contingency operation’ has the meaning

1 given the term in section 101(a)(13) of title 10,
2 United States Code.

3 “(B) INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY.—The
4 term ‘intelligence community’ has the meaning
5 given the term in section 3(4) of the National
6 Security Act of 1947 (50 U.S.C. 401a(4)).

7 “(C) VETERAN.—The term ‘veteran’ has
8 the meaning given the term in section 101(2) of
9 title 38, United States Code.”.
