REPORT

[To accompany H. Res. 117]

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 117, by a record vote of 8 to 3, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for consideration of H.J. Res. 117, the Continuing Appropriations Resolution, 2013, under a closed rule. The resolution provides one hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on Appropriations. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the joint resolution. The resolution provides that the joint resolution shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the joint resolution. The resolution provides one motion to recommit.

Section 2 of the resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 6365, the National Security and Job Protection Act, under a closed rule. The resolution provides one hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on the Budget. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The resolution provides that the bill shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the bill. Finally, the resolution provides one motion to recommit.

EXPLANATION OF WAIVERS

The waiver of all points of order against consideration of H.J. Res. 117 includes a waiver of section 302(f) of the Congressional Budget Act, prohibiting consideration of legislation providing new budget authority in excess of a committee's 302 allocation of such authority.
