
PROVIDING FOR CONSIDERATION OF THE BILL (H.R. 2842) TO
AUTHORIZE ALL BUREAU OF RECLAMATION CONDUIT
FACILITIES FOR HYDROPOWER DEVELOPMENT UNDER
FEDERAL RECLAMATION LAW, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution ____, by a nonrecord vote, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for consideration of H.R. 2842, the Bureau of Reclamation Small Conduit Hydropower Development and Rural Jobs Act of 2011, under a modified open rule. The resolution provides one hour of general debate equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on Natural Resources. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The resolution makes in order the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended by the Committee on Natural Resources now printed in the bill as original text for purpose of amendment, and provides that each section shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against the amendment in the nature of a substitute. The resolution makes in order only those amendments that have been submitted for printing in the Congressional Record dated at least one day before the day of consideration of the amendment and pro forma amendments for the purpose of debate. Each amendment submitted for printing in the Congressional Record may be offered only by the Member who submitted it for printing or the Member's designee, and each such amendment shall be considered as read if printed. The resolution provides one motion to recommit with or without instructions.

Finally, the resolution provides that the chair of the Committee on

Financial Services is authorized, on behalf of the committee, to file a supplemental report to accompany H.R. 3606.

EXPLANATION OF WAIVERS

Although the resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill, the Committee is not aware of any points of order. The waiver is prophylactic in nature.

Mr. BISHOP of Utah, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 2842) to authorize all Bureau of Reclamation conduit facilities for hydro-power development under Federal Reclamation law, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the State of the Union for consid-
5 eration of the bill (H.R. 2842) to authorize all Bureau

1 of Reclamation conduit facilities for hydropower develop-
2 ment under Federal Reclamation law, and for other pur-
3 poses. The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with.
4 All points of order against consideration of the bill are
5 waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill and
6 shall not exceed one hour equally divided and controlled
7 by the chair and ranking minority member of the Com-
8 mittee on Natural Resources. After general debate the bill
9 shall be considered for amendment under the five-minute
10 rule. It shall be in order to consider as an original bill
11 for the purpose of amendment under the five-minute rule
12 the amendment in the nature of a substitute recommended
13 by the Committee on Natural Resources now printed in
14 the bill. Each section of the committee amendment in the
15 nature of a substitute shall be considered as read. All
16 points of order against the committee amendment in the
17 nature of a substitute are waived. No amendment to the
18 committee amendment in the nature of a substitute shall
19 be in order except: (1) those received for printing in the
20 portion of the Congressional Record designated for that
21 purpose in clause 8 of rule XVIII dated at least one day
22 before the day of consideration of the amendment; and (2)
23 pro forma amendments for the purpose of debate. Each
24 amendment so received may be offered only by the Mem-
25 ber who caused it to be printed or a designee and shall

1 be considered as read if printed. At the conclusion of con-
2 sideration of the bill for amendment the Committee shall
3 rise and report the bill to the House with such amend-
4 ments as may have been adopted. Any Member may de-
5 mand a separate vote in the House on any amendment
6 adopted in the Committee of the Whole to the bill or to
7 the committee amendment in the nature of a substitute.
8 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on
9 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without
10 intervening motion except one motion to recommit with
11 or without instructions.

12 SEC. 2. The chair of the Committee on Financial
13 Services is authorized, on behalf of the committee, to file
14 a supplemental report to accompany H.R. 3606.
