



AMENDMENT TO H. RES. 676

OFFERED BY M. _____

In the first section of the resolution—

(1) strike “That the Speaker” and insert “That
(a) The Speaker”; and

(2) add at the end the following new subsection:

1 (b) No civil action initiated, or in which the House
2 intervenes, pursuant to this resolution may have as its
3 subject any of the provisions of law described in subsection
4 (c).

5 (c) The provisions of law described in this subsection
6 are as follows:

7 (1) COVERAGE OF ADULT CHILDREN UNTIL
8 AGE 26.—Section 2714 of the Public Health Service
9 Act (42 U.S.C. 300gg-14), relating to the extension
10 of dependent coverage for adult children until age
11 18.

12 (2) PREVENTIVE HEALTH SERVICES.—Section
13 2713 of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C.
14 300gg-13), relating to the coverage of preventive
15 health services without cost sharing, including well-
16 woman preventive care visits, breast cancer screen-
17 ing, mammography, screening for gestational diabe-

1 tes, and screening for interpersonal and domestic vi-
2 olence.

3 (3) PROHIBITION OF PREEXISTING CONDITION
4 EXCLUSIONS.—Section 2704 of the Public Health
5 Service Act (42 U.S.C. 300gg-3), relating to the
6 prohibition of preexisting condition exclusions or
7 other discrimination based on health status.

8 (4) SMALL BUSINESS TAX CREDITS.—Section
9 45R of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, relating
10 to small employer health insurance credits.

11 (5) CLOSURE OF MEDICARE PART D DONUT
12 HOLE.—Section 1860D-14A of the Social Security
13 Act (42 U.S.C. 1395w-114a), relating to the Medi-
14 care part D coverage gap discount program.
