

## MOTION TO RECOMMIT H.R. 761

\_\_\_\_\_ moves to recommit the bill H.R. 761 to the Committee on Natural Resources with instructions to report the same back to the House forthwith with the following amendment:

At the end of title I (page 12, after line 2), add the following new sections:

1 **SEC. 105. PROHIBITIONS REGARDING CHINA AND IRAN.**

2 (a) PROHIBITION ON EXPORT.—Each Federal min-  
3 eral exploration or mine permit issued pursuant to this  
4 Act shall include provisions that prohibit export to China  
5 or Iran of strategic and critical minerals produced under  
6 the permit.

7 (b) PROHIBITION ON ISSUANCE OF PERMITS.—No  
8 Federal mineral exploration or mine permit may be issued  
9 pursuant to this Act to any company in which China or  
10 Iran has an ownership interest.

11 (c) PRESIDENTIAL WAIVER OF PROHIBITIONS WITH  
12 RESPECT TO CHINA.—The President may waive the prohi-  
13 bitions under subsections (a) and (b) with respect to China  
14 upon certification that the Government of China has re-

1 moved its export restraints on strategic and critical min-  
2 erals.

3 **SEC. 106. PROHIBITION ON ISSUANCE OF PERMITS TO PER-**  
4 **SONS, CORPORATIONS, AND SUBSIDIARIES**  
5 **CONVICTED OF VIOLATING SANCTIONS LAWS.**

6 No Federal mineral exploration or mine permit shall  
7 be issued pursuant to this Act to a person, corporation,  
8 partnership, trust, or other form of business organization  
9 that has been convicted of violating the Iran Sanctions Act  
10 of 1996 (50 U.S.C. 1701 note), the Comprehensive Iran  
11 Sanctions, Accountability, and Divestment Act of 2010  
12 (22 U.S.C. 8501 et seq.), the Iran Threat Reduction and  
13 Syria Human Rights Act of 2012 (22 U.S.C. 8701 et  
14 seq.), or the International Emergency Economic Powers  
15 Act (50 U.S.C. 1701 et seq.).
