The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution ____, by a nonrecord vote, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for consideration of H.J. Res. 64, disapproving of the agreement transmitted to Congress by the President on July 19, 2015, relating to the nuclear program of Iran, under a closed rule. The resolution provides ten hours of debate equally divided among and controlled by the respective chairs and ranking minority members of the Committees on Foreign Affairs, Financial Services, the Judiciary, Oversight and Government Reform, and Ways and Means. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the joint resolution. The resolution provides that the joint resolution shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the joint resolution. The resolution provides a final period of debate, which shall not exceed one hour equally divided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee on Foreign Affairs. The resolution provides one motion to recommit.

Section 2 of the resolution provides that upon receipt of a message from the Senate transmitting H.J. Res. 61 with a Senate amendment to the text thereof consisting only of the text of H.J. Res. 64 as passed by the House, the House shall be considered to have concurred in the Senate

amendment or amendments.

EXPLANATION OF WAIVERS

2 shall be in order to consider in the House the joint resolu-
3 tion (H.J. Res. 64) disapproving of the agreement trans-
4 mitted to Congress by the President on July 19, 2015,
5 relating to the nuclear program of Iran. All points of order

1 against consideration of the joint resolution are waived.
2 The joint resolution shall be considered as read. All points
3 of order against provisions in the joint resolution are
4 waived. The previous question shall be considered as or-
5 dered on the joint resolution and on any amendment
6 thereto to final passage without intervening motion except:
7 (1) ten hours of debate equally divided among and con-
8 trolled by the respective chairs and ranking minority mem-
9 bers of the Committees on Foreign Affairs, Financial
10 Services, the Judiciary, Oversight and Government Re-
11 form, and Ways and Means; (2) a final period of debate
12 which shall not exceed one hour equally divided and con-
13 trolled by the chair and ranking minority member of the
14 Committee on Foreign Affairs; and (3) one motion to re-
15 commit.

16 SEC. 2. Upon receipt of a message from the Senate
17 transmitting House Joint Resolution 61 with a Senate
18 amendment to the text thereof consisting only of the text
19 of House Joint Resolution 64 as passed by the House, the
20 House shall be considered to have taken from the Speak-
21 er's table House Joint Resolution 61, with the Senate
22 amendment to the text thereof and any amendment to the
23 title thereof, and to have concurred in the Senate amend-
24 ment or amendments.
