OFFERED BY MR. CONDIT OF CALIFORNIA

Page 84, after line 16, insert the following:

1 **TITLE VIII—FOREIGN ASSIST-**
2 **ANCE REPORTING REFORM**

3 **SECTION 801. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This title may be cited as the “Foreign Assistance
5 Reporting Reform Act of 1999”.

6 **SEC. 802. PROHIBITION ON FOREIGN ASSISTANCE AND**
7 **CONTRIBUTIONS UNLESS CERTAIN REPORT-**
8 **ING REQUIREMENTS ARE MET.**

9 Chapter 1 of part III of the Foreign Assistance Act
10 of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2351) is amended—

11 (1) by redesignating the second section 620G
12 (as added by section 149 of Public Law 104–164
13 (110 Stat. 1436)) as section 620J; and

14 (2) by adding at the end the following:

15 **“SEC. 620K. PROHIBITION ON FOREIGN ASSISTANCE AND**
16 **CONTRIBUTIONS UNLESS CERTAIN REPORT-**
17 **ING REQUIREMENTS ARE MET.**

18 “(a) PROHIBITION.—Notwithstanding any other pro-
19 vision of law, United States assistance may not be pro-
20 vided to a foreign country, and contributions may not be

1 provided to an international organization, for a fiscal year
2 unless—

3 “(1) such country or organization, as the case
4 may be, prepares and transmits to the United States
5 a report in accordance with subsection (b); and

6 “(2) the President transmits each such report
7 to the Congress.

8 “(b) REPORTS TO THE UNITED STATES.—A foreign
9 country that seeks to obtain United States assistance or
10 other international organization that seeks to obtain a
11 United States contribution, shall prepare and transmit to
12 the United States a report that contains—

13 “(1) the amount of each type of United States
14 assistance or contribution sought;

15 “(2) the justification for seeking each such type
16 of assistance or contribution;

17 “(3) the objectives that each such type of as-
18 sistance or contribution is intended to achieve;

19 “(4) an estimation of the date by which—

20 “(A) the objectives of each type of assist-
21 ance or contribution will be achieved; and

22 “(B) such assistance or contribution can
23 be terminated; and

1 “(5) a commitment to provide a detailed ac-
2 counting of how such assistance or contribution was
3 spent.

4 “(c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section the term ‘United
5 States assistance’ means—

6 “(1) assistance authorized under this Act (such
7 as the development assistance program, the eco-
8 nomic support fund program, and the international
9 military education and training program) or author-
10 ized under the African Development Foundation
11 Act, section 401 of the Foreign Assistance Act of
12 1969 (relating to the Inter-American Development
13 Foundation), or any other foreign assistance legisla-
14 tion;

15 “(2) grant, credit, or guaranty assistance under
16 the Arms Export Control Act;

17 “(3) assistance under the Migration and Refu-
18 gee Assistance Act of 1962; or

19 “(4) assistance under any title of the Agricul-
20 tural Trade Development and Assistance Act of
21 1954.”.
