

**AMENDMENT TO H.R. 1401, AS REPORTED
OFFERED BY MR. GILMAN OF NEW YORK**

At the end of title XII (page 317, after line 17), insert the following new section:

1 **SEC. 1206. REPORT ON THE SECURITY SITUATION ON THE**
2 **KOREAN PENINSULA.**

3 (a) REPORT.—Not later than February 1, 2000, the
4 Secretary of Defense shall submit to the appropriate con-
5 gressional committees a report on the security situation
6 on the Korean peninsula. The report shall be submitted
7 in both classified and unclassified form.

8 (b) MATTERS TO BE INCLUDED.—The Secretary
9 shall include in the report under subsection (a) the follow-
10 ing:

11 (1) A net assessment analysis of the
12 warfighting capabilities of the Combined Forces
13 Command (CFC) of the United States and the Re-
14 public of Korea compared with the armed forces of
15 North Korea.

16 (2) An assessment of challenges posed by the
17 armed forces of North Korea to the defense of the
18 Republic of Korea and to United States forces de-
19 ployed to the region.

1 (3) An assessment of the current status and the
2 future direction of weapons of mass destruction pro-
3 grams and ballistic missile programs of North
4 Korea, including a determination as to whether or
5 not North Korea—

6 (A) is continuing to pursue a nuclear
7 weapons program;

8 (B) is seeking equipment and technology
9 with which to enrich uranium; and

10 (C) is pursuing an offensive biological
11 weapons program.

12 (c) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES.—

13 In this section, the term “appropriate congressional com-
14 mittees” means—

15 (1) the Committee on International Relations
16 and the Committee on Armed Services of the House
17 of Representatives; and

18 (2) the Committee on Foreign Relations and
19 the Committee on Armed Services of the Senate.
