 3 TARY SERVICE ON OR AFTER AUGUST 1, 1986.—(1) Sec-
 4 tion 1409(b) of title 10, United States Code, is amended—
 5 (A) by striking paragraph (2);
 6 (B) by redesignating paragraph (3) as para-
 7 graph (2); and

1 (C) in paragraph (1), by striking “paragraphs
2 (2) and (3)” and inserting “paragraph (2)”.

3 (2) Paragraph (3) of section 1401a(b) of such title
4 is amended to read as follows:

5 “(3) POST-AUGUST 1, 1986 MEMBERS.—

6 “(A) If the percent determined under para-
7 graph (2) is equal to or greater than 3 percent,
8 the Secretary shall increase the retired pay of
9 each member and former member who first be-
10 came a member on or after August 1, 1986, by
11 the difference between—

1 (e) APPLICABILITY CONTINGENT ON EMERGENCY
2 FUNDING DESIGNATION.—(1) Each of the amounts pro-
3 vided in subsection (d) is designated by the Congress as
4 an emergency requirement pursuant to section
5 251(b)(2)(A) of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
6 Deficit Control Act of 1985, as amended (2 U.S.C.
7 901(b)(2)(A)).

8 (2) Subsections (a), (b), and (c) (including the
9 amendments made by those subsections) shall take effect
10 only if, and the amounts provided in subsection (d) shall

19 For an additional amount for the costs of direct loans
20 and grants of the rural utilities programs described in sec-
