

PART B—TEXT OF AMENDMENT CONSIDERED AS ADOPTED

**AMENDMENT  
TO THE AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A  
SUBSTITUTE TO S. 627**

Page 13, line 5, strike “and \$1,262,000,000,000 in outlays,”.

Page 13, line 11, strike “and \$1,196,000,000,000 in outlays,”.

Page 17, line 7, insert “s” immediately before the colon.

Page 17, line 18, strike the closed quotation mark and the period at the end, and insert the following:

1       “(e) ENFORCEMENT OF DISCRETIONARY SPENDING  
2 CAPS.—It shall not be in order in the House of Represent-  
3 atives or the Senate to consider any bill, joint resolution,  
4 amendment, motion, or conference report that would cause  
5 the discretionary spending limits as set forth in section  
6 251 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Con-  
7 trol Act to be exceeded.”.

Page 18, after line 22, add the following new subsection:

1 (d) APPEALS FOR DISCRETIONARY CAPS.—Section  
2 904(c)(2) of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 is  
3 amended by striking “and 312(c)” and inserting “312(c),  
4 and 314(e)”.

Page 27, line 9, strike “receipt of the certification”  
and insert “introduction of a joint resolution”.

Page 27, line 19, strike “Congress receives a certifi-  
cation” and insert “introduction of a joint resolution”.

Page 32, strike line 6 through page 33, line 4 and  
insert the following:

5 “(4) CONSIDERATION AFTER PASSAGE.—(A) If  
6 Congress passes a joint resolution, the period begin-  
7 ning on the date the President is presented with the  
8 joint resolution and ending on the date the President  
9 signs, allows to become law without his signature, or  
10 vetoes and returns the joint resolution (but exclud-  
11 ing days when either House is not in session) shall  
12 be disregarded in computing the appropriate cal-  
13 endar day period described in subsection (b)(1).

14 “(B) debate on a veto message in the Sen-  
15 ate under this section shall be 1 hour equally  
16 divided between the majority and minority lead-  
17 ers or their designees.”
