
PROVIDING FOR CONSIDERATION OF THE BILL (S. 524) TO
AUTHORIZE THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO AWARD GRANTS
TO ADDRESS THE NATIONAL EPIDEMICS OF PRESCRIPTION
OPIOID ABUSE AND HEROIN USE

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution____, by a nonrecord vote, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for consideration of S. 524, the Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act of 2016, under a closed rule. The resolution provides one hour of debate equally divided among and controlled by the chairs and ranking minority members of the Committee on Energy and Commerce and the Committee on the Judiciary. The resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill. The resolution provides that the amendment in the nature of a substitute consisting of the respective texts of the bills as specified in the resolution shall be considered as adopted, and the bill, as amended, shall be considered as read. The resolution waives all points of order against provisions in the bill, as amended. The resolution provides one motion to commit with or without instructions.

The resolution directs the Clerk to, in forming the amendment in the nature of a substitute, assign appropriate designations, conform cross-references and provisions for short titles, and authorizes the Clerk to make technical and conforming changes.

The resolution provides that upon passage of S. 524, the title of such bill is amended as specified in the resolution.

The resolution provides that if S. 524 is passed, then it shall be in order for the chair of the Committee on Energy and Commerce or his

designee to move that the House insist on its amendments to S. 524 and request a conference with the Senate thereon.

EXPLANATION OF WAIVERS

Although the resolution waives all points of order against consideration of the bill, the Committee is not aware of any points of order. The waiver is prophylactic in nature.

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (S. 524) to authorize the Attorney General to award grants to address the national epidemics of prescription opioid abuse and heroin use.

- 1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
- 2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (S. 524)
- 3 to authorize the Attorney General to award grants to ad-
- 4 dress the national epidemics of prescription opioid abuse
- 5 and heroin use. All points of order against consideration

1 of the bill are waived. An amendment in the nature of
2 a substitute consisting of the respective texts of the bills
3 specified in section 2(a) of this resolution shall be consid-
4 ered as adopted. The bill, as amended, shall be considered
5 as read. All points of order against provisions in the bill,
6 as amended, are waived. The previous question shall be
7 considered as ordered on the bill, as amended, to final pas-
8 sage without intervening motion except: (1) one hour of
9 debate equally divided among and controlled by the chair
10 and ranking minority member of the Committee on En-
11 ergy and Commerce and the chair and ranking minority
12 member of the Committee on the Judiciary; and (2) one
13 motion to commit with or without instructions.

14 SEC. 2. (a) The bills referred to in the first section
15 of this resolution are as follows: H.R. 4641, H.R. 5046,
16 H.R. 4063, H.R. 4985, H.R. 5048, H.R. 5052, H.R.
17 4843, H.R. 4978, H.R. 3680, H.R. 3691, H.R. 1818,
18 H.R. 4969, H.R. 4586, H.R. 4599, H.R. 4976, H.R.
19 4982, H.R. 4981, and H.R. 1725, in each case as passed
20 by the House.

21 (b) In forming the amendment in the nature of a sub-
22 stitute referred to in the first section of this resolution,
23 the Clerk—

1 (1) shall assign appropriate designations to pro-
2 visions within the amendment in the nature of a
3 substitute;

4 (2) shall conform cross-references and provi-
5 sions for short titles within the amendment in the
6 nature of a substitute; and

7 (3) is authorized to make technical corrections
8 within the amendment in the nature of a substitute,
9 to include corrections in spelling, punctuation, page
10 and line numbering, section numbering, and inser-
11 tion of appropriate headings.

12 SEC. 3. Upon passage of S. 524 the title of such bill
13 is amended to read as follows: "To authorize the Attorney
14 General and Secretary of Health and Human Services to
15 award grants to address the national epidemics of pre-
16 scription opioid abuse and heroin use, and to provide for
17 the establishment of an inter-agency task force to review,
18 modify, and update best practices for pain management
19 and prescribing pain medication, and for other purposes."

20 SEC. 4. If S. 524, as amended, is passed, then it shall
21 be in order for the chair of the Committee on Energy and
22 Commerce or his designee to move that the House insist
23 on its amendments to S. 524 and request a conference
24 with the Senate thereon.
